



## **2011 QUEENSLAND CHAPTER STATE AEROBATIC TITLES**

1. **Venue**

The State Titles will be held at Watts Bridge Memorial Airfield Queensland 11<sup>th</sup> June to 13<sup>th</sup> June 2011 inclusive.

2. **Contest Entry**

All members of the Australian Aerobatic Club are eligible to compete. It is a requirement that all Unlimited, Advanced and Intermediate pilots must have completed the Judges Home Study Course and be prepared to judge at the competition to be eligible to compete.

4. Registration - Pilots

a) Contestants must be registered by Saturday 11<sup>th</sup> June 2011 The closing time for registrations is 10:00 hours on Saturday

b) The following documents must be produced:-

- A current Pilot's Licence
- A current Medical Certificate
- A Bi-ennial Flight Review
- Low Level Waiver appropriate to the competition level being flown
- AAC. Membership Card
- FAI Sporting Licence.
- Free Sequence: - 1 copy Checked and Certified by a National Judge  
6 copies of Form A, the judges score sheet  
12 copies of Forms B & C - the flow charts showing flight from left to right and right to left.

5. Aircraft

- All aircraft must be radio equipped in accordance with the rules of the AAC.
- The Chairman of the Technical Committee will inspect each aircraft prior to the first practice flight and subsequently at the request of the Contest Director.
- Aircraft with defects may be refused registration or may have registration withdrawn by the Technical Committee.

6. Registration - Aircraft

The following documents must be produced:-

- Certificate of Airworthiness
- Certificate of Registration
- Current maintenance release
- Insurance certificate showing third party cover of \$5,000,000 the policy must also state that it is valid for aerobatic contests.

7. Briefing

The first competition briefing will be held at 0800 hours Saturday 11<sup>th</sup> June 2011. Subsequent briefings will be held each contest day at 0800 hours. Competitors who fail to attend briefing will be disqualified. Competitors who arrive late will be penalised.

All Officials and Judges are required to attend the briefings.

Competitors wishing to practice on site prior to the first briefing on Saturday 11<sup>th</sup> June 2011 must advise the Contest Director or their delegate. Practice will not be permitted until the Contest Director, Chief Judge or their Delegate, has briefed the competitor.

8. Contest Rules

The contest will be conducted according to the rules of the AAC.  
Unlimited and Advanced category contestants will also be governed by CIVA Rules.

9. Practice

- Official practice starts on Saturday 11<sup>th</sup> June 2011, after the 0800 hours briefing and will end 15 minutes before End of Daylight (EOD) for Graduate, Sportsman and Intermediate pilots only.
- Unlimited and Advanced competitors will be required to fly their Qualifying flight on Saturday.
- All competitors except Unlimited and Advanced competitors will if possible be allowed 10 minutes practice in the box. Unlimited and Advanced practice will be included with the Q programme as per CIVA Regulations.
- Competitors will not be permitted to fly other than during the official practice or competition after 0800 hours on Saturday 11<sup>th</sup> June 2011.
- Competitors who arrive after the Saturday briefing will not be permitted to practice before being briefed by either the Contest Director, Starter or Safety Director.

10. Free Sequences

- Forms A, B and C (Judges Score Sheet and Flow Charts) are available on the web site.
- Free sequences that have been signed off by a National Judge must be submitted with your entry form or emailed to [tracy@aeros.com.au](mailto:tracy@aeros.com.au) by 04/06/2011 for entering into the competition scoring system. VISIO with the ARESTI 2010 Power soft copy is the preferred delivery method.
- If you do not submit your free sequence until registration, registration may be refused. If you alter your sequence after it has been checked, a signed off copy must be resubmitted before registration.

11. Fuel and Oil

The Airfield has a Fuel Bowser that requires a credit card to access the fuel.

12. Hangarage

Limited hangarage may be available. Please advise your requirements when sending your entry form

13. Accommodation

It is each participant's responsibility to book his or her own accommodation.

It will be possible to camp in the clubhouse. Please advise the Secretary if you wish to stay at the airfield.

Cost will be \$15 per night and members will need to bring their own bedding/camping gear.

Accommodation can be booked at either Esk or Toogoolawah, as Watts Bridge is about half way between both (10/15 minute drive in either direction). The available accommodation options listed in the Tourism Guide attached to the email notification
